Share The Plate, June 16

If the term 'Walking the Walk' needed a picture to illustrate what that looks like, the team of four women who created **Humanity Now: Direct Refugee Relief** would be a fitting choice. Founded in Wilmington in early 2016 to address the desperate needs of refugees in Greece, the **Humanity Now** team raises money in the United States to invest in low-cost, practical projects helping displaced people, supporting both essential needs and long-term goals, like education and job-training. Because the all-volunteer team pays for their own administrative/travel costs, 100 percent of your gift will go directly to support displaced people, including those in Poland and Ukraine as well.

Last year the group raised \$109,000 for small-scale, targeted funding that will have a significant impact. Here is just a small sample of some of these projects:

• \$2,300 will purchase a refrigerator for a food distribution team providing up to 7,000 meals a month to refugees and migrants in Athens (Saffron Kitchen Project).

- \$5,400 will fund a 5-day summer camp in Poland for 25 people, all of whom are disabled refugee children and their family members (Mudita Association).
- **\$6,000** will furnish a bomb-shelter schoolroom for 50 internally displaced children in the village of Hrun, near the Russian border in Ukraine (Stand with Ukraine Foundation).

With all the bad news these days, it's easy to feel powerless. In fact, as these projects demonstrate, your donations can do a lot to ease suffering. What a wonderful opportunity to see our donations help these vulnerable children and their families, giving them help, hope and a sense of humanity. Let's walk with **Humanity, Now.**

1. <u>Email Your County Commissioners!!</u> This action is like the emails we sent in May to the State Board of Elections, but this time, we're emailing County Commissioners to advocate for adequate funding for elections. Will take you less than 10 minutes. **Deadline is June 17!**

Here are **5 easy steps**:

Step 1: Address an email to one of these recipients depending on where you live:

New Hanover County: nhcgov.com Brunswick County: boardclerk@brunswickcountync.gov

Step 2: Write **FY25 Budget** in the subject line.

Step 3: Type (or copy and paste) the message below. (Be sure to indicate the correct name of your county and include your name and address):

Dear County Commissioners,

I am a resident of ______ County and I am emailing you to request that you support sufficient funding to support accessible, safe, and fair elections. These funds are needed to adequately provide adequate early polling sites and hours; voter education; recruitment, training, and retention of poll workers; and functional voting equipment and technology. Please keep these needs in mind as you vote on the budget for the upcoming fiscal year.

2. <u>Email Your State Legislator!!</u> Urgent Call to Action from Democracy NC - Tell Lawmakers to Vote No on HB 237. "Anti-democratic politicians in the NC legislature are trying to ram through a bad bill that would make it harder for people, including those with medical conditions, to wear masks in public to protect their health. But the same bill would make it much easier for wealthy donors to mask their identities when pouring money into political parties, and from there into candidates' campaign bank accounts. <u>HB 237 would tear down protections against the corrosive influence of big money in our elections.</u> If it passes, our elections could be flooded by unaccountable cash from self-interested mega-donors, all while keeping North Carolina voters in the dark." <u>ACT NOW:Tell the legislature that we refuse to let</u>

wealthy political donors buy our elections in North Carolina! [It's easy; just fill in your name address and click write letter, which is there for you. They will send it to the right person.]
