**This worksheet** allows you to share some of your initial thoughts about what you would like to happen at your funeral.

•	Eulogist(s) Who would you like to speak? What stories would you like shared?
•	<b>Music</b> , what kind of music would you like? What songs would be most meaningful to you?
•	<b>Food/beverages</b> , after the service, what kind of celebration would you like. (professionally catered, provided "potluck" by attendees, or other arrangement?)
•	Pallbearers, (if the final disposition involves a graveside service)
•	<b>Personal touches</b> , such as a memory board, memorial video, ppt slide show, personal memorabilia.
•	<b>Donations</b> in your memory, what organizations or options would you like to offer?
